This project was set in a building which had previously been owned by the Post Office the building was mid 18<sup>th</sup> century and our clients were recommended to us by Historic Scotland.

Strangely even though this is quite a substantial building it didn't have one tiled floor from the Victorian Era!

This floor was awkward to set out as we were constrained by the fact that either side the walls were bowed in or bowed out, we set the field tiles to the nearest decent finish until the clients were happy with the outcome in this case a full pattern down the centre of the floor.

Pictures provided by the client our camera ended up fogged because of the brutal weather while we were there. A small porch was also tiled after lifting heavy slate slabs first and putting down a levelling compound.
